

Maria Mironidou-Tzouveleki MD, PhD, is Professor emeritus of the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. She has also a PhD in anesthesiology. Furthermore, she has a degree of Italian Language and Literature. Since 1982 she has been working and teaching at the Faculty of Medicine in the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. Currently she is a Professor emeritus of Pharmacology at the A' Laboratory of Pharmacology, in the same department, where she continues lecturing and is engaged in research programs. Moreover, she organizes and/or participates in other undergraduate and postgraduate programs of the

Medical School, with lectures regarding pharmacology, evidence-based medicine and research methods. She has contributed in 10 books and over 500 papers and is member of many Greek and international scientific organizations like the International Medical Olympicus Association where she has been secretary and other organizations.

She is quite interested in teaching and guiding students and new colleagues, and especially guides them to contribute to Society. These goals are her institutional and personal commitment and obligation as an academic teacher. She has organized or actively participated in multiple actions that support the above.

She is scientific coordinator of the program "Med School". Med School is an innovative educational health program which aims at informing high schools' students about major medical and social issues in the District of Macedonia, Greece, approved by the Greek Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs. She is also scientific coordinator of the Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) program approved by the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki Research Committee and funded by Special Account for Research Grants. This is a program aiming at educating not only the members of the AUTH scientific community but also the general public on how to perform first aids - CPR.
