



Georgia Papantoniou is Associate Professor of Cognitive Psychology at the University of Ioannina. She is the author and co-author of 90 articles, published in international and Greek scientific journals and books, as well as 150 papers in international and Greek conferences. Mrs. Papantoniou is Editor of the Journal of Research in Education and Training and has been Guest Editor of the Hellenic Journal of Psychology, Member of a Guest Editorial Board of the Hellenic Journal of Nuclear Medicine, and Reviewer in 16 international scientific journals. She is the Director of the Psychology Lab of the Department of Early Childhood Education of the University of Ioannina and member of the Lab of Neurodegenerative Diseases of the Center for Interdisciplinary Research and Innovation of AUTH. Mrs. Papantoniou has been Head of the Department of Psychology, and Vice-Head of the Department of Early Childhood Education of the University of Ioannina. She is also the Secretary of the Executive Committee of the “Society of Friends of the Greek Association for Alzheimer’s Disease and Related Disorders” and she was member of the Executive Committee of the Psychological Society of Northern Greece. Her research interests include self-regulation, psychological assessment, and various aspects of lifelong cognitive development, especially those related to intelligence.
